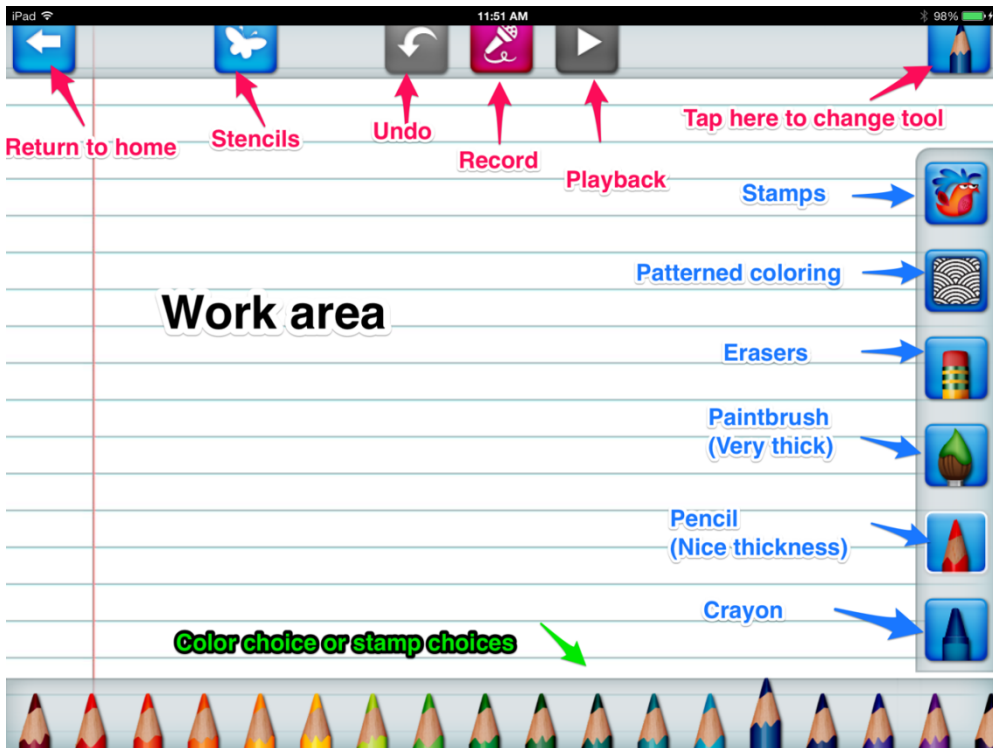
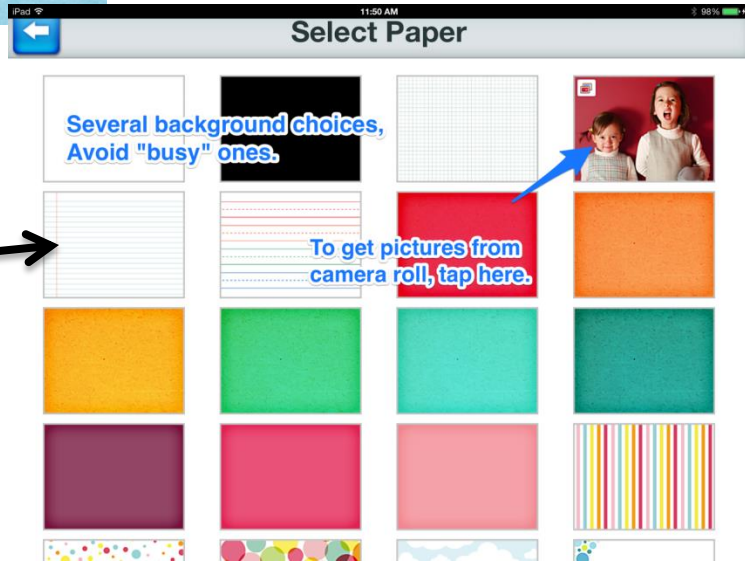




A simple screen casting app for younger children. Every part of the process is verbalized. No reading!

Several "papers" (backgrounds) available. Some are too busy!

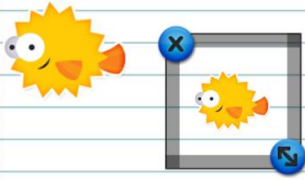
Can also use the iPad camera to take a photo then open Draw & Tell and choose image from photos.



Simple work area. Tap on icon in top right corner to show all tools.



Adding stamps



Tap on the stamp. Then tap where you want to place it. Resize if necessary.

Several stamps are available – mostly comic creatures.



Recording is very simple. Directions are given and then there is a countdown.

Objects can be moved as student records. While recording, students can use the blue highlighter to show concepts.

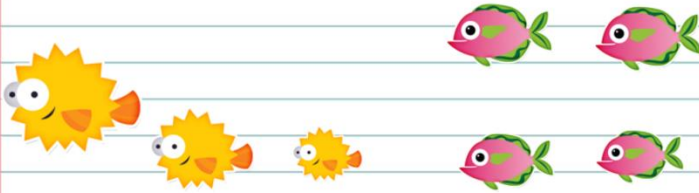
Unlike some screen casting apps, you can't draw while recording but you can manipulate objects. Focus is on verbalizing content.



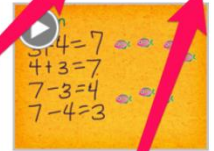
Sends you to saved work

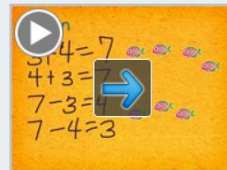
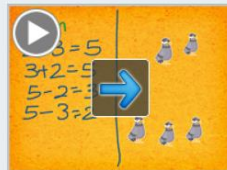
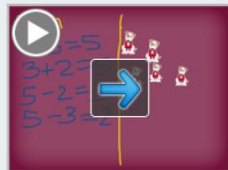
Send to camera roll (photos)

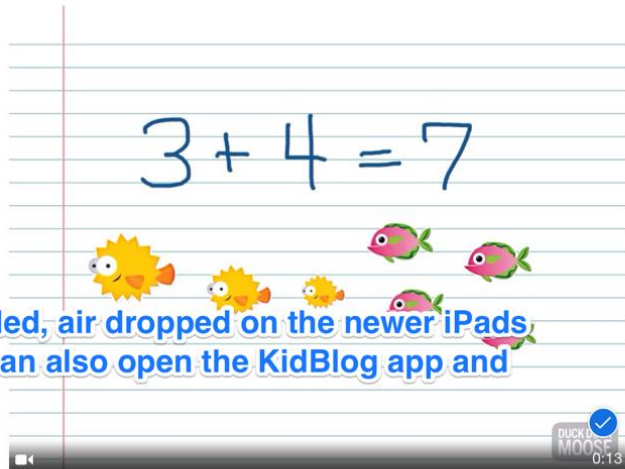
